February 20, 2019

\*Called to order at 8:04 by Chair Bo Marks.

1<sup>st</sup> order of business: Adoption of meeting agenda; one correction made- “two” teacher grants changed to “one” in Budget and Grants section. Approved by unanimous consent.

2<sup>nd</sup> order of business: Adoption of January 16, 2019 meeting minutes. Mr. Marks brought forward changes made to the Budget and Grants section to clarify details. Changes were presented to the committee and reviewed. Mr. Kersten moved to approve, Mr. Hecht seconded. Approved unanimously.

### Principal's report:

- Soundwave Band qualified 22 students for state. Color guard placed 1<sup>st</sup> in their competition and percussion placed 2<sup>nd</sup>. The state competition will take place in Ft. Walton Beach on 3/8/19.
- 3 students qualified as Merit Scholar finalists: M. O’Grady, J. Ratkowiak, & B. Van Sleen
- Boys Track placed 1<sup>st</sup> overall in their first track meet on 2/16. Girls Track placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall. Track has added javelin as a new field event this year.
- Girls Soccer will play American Heritage on 2/22/19 for the state title in Deland. The school will participate in a send-off on 2/21.
- Mock Trial beat Navarre and will compete today in semi-finals against Catholic.
- Vaping Awareness Seminar- rescheduled from 2/14 to 2/22. Students will attend the seminar during the school day and parents are welcome at the evening presentation.
- Gym lobby bathrooms will be used only during athletic events held in the gym. They will remain locked during the school day.
- Duty and detention monies for the school year- Mr. Brothers is requesting the full amount to cover (approx.\$7900). Mrs. Haynes stated for the record that SAC did give \$6000 last year, which came out of the SIP account.
- New front door procedures- all visitors must have ID to enter the building. All exterior doors will remain locked at all times during school hours.

### Student representatives' report:

- Seniors: Currently working on finding a senior gift.
- Juniors: Working on prom
- Sophomores: Selling spring break t-shirts. Also selling car magnets one for \$10, two for \$15.
- Freshmen: Working on spirit nights to raise money.
- Quentin Cooper 5K: will be a color run held on 4/20/19 at the field house to raise money for a local child with medical needs. Sign-up should be available online soon.
- Dance Marathon was successful- raised over \$10, 000 and will be held again next year.

- PTSO had 18 teacher grant requests for spring. PTSO balance for grants is \$4378.46

School Improvement Plan Report:

- New SIP format could be forthcoming for the next school year.

Budgets and Grants Report:

- No new teacher grant requests at this time- Mr. Ford will send out an email to remind staff of monies available
- SIP account- had a plus up of \$3233.78. The Hobbs grant has not yet been taken from the account (\$105). With the extra money and the grant money taken out, the current balance will be \$5872.78
- A+ account- \$3603.67. The Alt grant has not been taken out yet; neither has the money requested for detention and duties.

Bylaws and Elections Report:

- Linda Youberg, Chair, circulated a rough draft of the current bylaws and reviewed all changes made by the Bylaws and Elections Committee. Any questions/comments should be sent to Mrs. Youberg. SAC will vote on approving the bylaws at our March meeting.

Old Business:

- Five-Star School Award: New application is not yet available; however, Mr. Kersten will write the rough draft to have available. Looking at April for new application to be out.

New business:

- Healthy School Team presentation by Karen Petsch and Melissa Fisher- all fundraisers with food that occur during the school year must follow the same nutritional guidelines as food served in the cafeteria. A total of 15 days per school year can be used to sell items outside the guidelines but must be pre-approved by the principal.
